

Youth Leadership Calhoun County Scholarship Guidelines Class of 2015

The award can only be used for tuition and related expenses as defined by the Internal Revenue Service: "tuition and fees required for the enrollment or attendance of a student(s) at an education organization described in section 170(b)(1)(A)(ii) required for courses of instruction at such an educational organization."

Eligibility: <u>Applicants must be a graduate of YLCC</u>, <u>a 2015 high school graduate and be</u> <u>accepted at an accredited college or university within the state of Alabama</u>. The award will be given without regard to race, religion, gender, national origin or disability.

Spouses, children, adopted children, and grandchildren of LCC Board of Directors, LCC Program Director, Calhoun County Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors and Calhoun County Chamber of Commerce employees are prohibited from applying or receiving any scholarship from Leadership Calhoun County.

Payment of Award: Payment is made to the student's account for the fall semester tuition and fees expenses at the beginning of the academic quarter or semester upon the selection committee's receipt of certified proof of enrollment / class registration from the institution. Payment will be made directly to the institution of higher education. In the event the award recipient withdraws from college and any refund is due, the money will not go to the student, but will be returned to LCC.

One time Award: This award is not renewable.

Essay: An essay is required with the application. The composition should be typed, at least 2 pages but not to exceed 4 pages in length, size 12 font, and be double spaced.

- Define personal aspirations
- State career path goals and reason for choosing
- State career responsibilities
- State potential personal contribution to chosen profession
- Include all work, volunteer, or leadership experience
- Any special circumstances or need

Applicants will submit by deadline of Thursday, January 29, 2015 by 4:00 p.m.:

- Completed application form
- 2 letters of recommendation
- Current GPA and ACT scores validated by school official from his/her high school
- Essay
- Applicants must be accepted at a college or university within the state of Alabama

Priority will be given to scholarship applicants with:

- Discernable academic ability
- Strong moral character and leadership experience
- Recognized school or community service
- Acceptance or current attendance at college in Alabama with special consideration given to JSU and GSCC
